



The goal of the FMP is to


- o Identify and assess flood hazards within Sea Isle
- o Establish goals and objectives for floodplain management
- Present a series of actions designed to minimize flooding and mitigate the impacts from flooding in the future





Project Background

- Sea Isle City is one of the first municipalities of New Jersey to be recognized as a Class 3 community under the CRS Program
 - o 35% flood insurance discount
- The main objective of the FMP is to analyze and implement measures directed at reducing the impacts of hazards on the City
- The City cherishes the collaboration with residents and surrounding areas facing similar hazards


